First Pitch

The No.40 Golden Eagles embark on the 2008 baseball season this weekend at the UTSA Baseball Classic in San Antonio, Texas. On Friday, ORU begins the season with a match-up against Army, who returns 14 letterwinners from last year's club that finished 25-23-1 and placed second in the Patriot League. In the second game of the Friday twin bill, ORU faces host Texas-San Antonio. Like ORU, UTSA has earned some preseason recognition by receiving votes in the Collegiate Baseball poll. On Saturday, ORU will face its toughest match-up battling No. 19/RV/32 Louisiana-Lafayette in a single game. The Golden Eagles will round up the classic on Sunday, battling Big 12 Conference foe Texas Tech.

The Coaches

Rob Walton is in his fifth season as ORU head coach, with a record of 173-64 (.730). Walton earned national recognition in the summer by being named the Team USA Baseball head coach for the 2008 summer. In only five years, Walton is the winningest coach in ORU history and has twice earned conference coach of the year honors. Army is led by **Joe Sottolano** who is 210-159-5 (.568) in seven years with the Black Knights. **Sherman Corbett**, 211-194 in seven years, is at the helm of UTSA. Louisiana-Lafayette is coached by **Tony Robichaux** who has a record of 492-301 in 13 seasons with the Ragin' Cajuns. Texas Tech is led by veteran coach **Larry Hays**. Hays is the winningest coach in Tech history with 789 wins at TTU and has an overall mark of 1,484-830-4.

Scouting The Opponents

Army - The Black Knights are coming off a 25-23-1 season and a 12-7 second-place finish in the Patriot League in 2007. They are led by 2007 Patriot League Player of the Year Cole White who is a preseason All-American. White led the squad with a .408 average and 73 hits. Army was tabbed to finish third this season in the Patriot League. ORU and Army have met once, with Army winning 6-5 in 1979.

Texas-San Antonio - The Roadrunners are coming off a very successful season that saw them finish 36-22 and 24-6 in Southland Conference play. UTSA captured the SLC Championship last season and are picked to

repeat. They are led by infielder Trent Lockwood who hit a team-leading .378 last season with 14 homers and 57 RBI. UTSA leads the all-time series with ORU, 4-3, having last played each other in 2005.

Louisiana-Lafayette - The Ragin' Cajuns were a great story in 2007, finishing with a 40-17 overall mark and advancing to the NCAA Regionals where they were limited by host Texas A&M in the championship game. ULL enters 2008 with a No. 19 ranking by Baseball America and are favored to repeat as the Sun Belt Conference Champions. ORU leads the all-time series, 5-3, while the two have not faced each other since 1997.

Texas Tech - The Red Raiders are looking to rebound in 2008 after going 28-27 in 2007 and missing the Big 12 Conference Tournament, finishing with a 8-18 conference mark. Texas Tech is led by preseason All-American right-fielder Roger Kieschnick. Kieschnick hit .302 with 13 home runs and 36 RBI while playing and starting all 57 games in 2007. ORU and Tech are tied, 7-7, and have not played since 2006.

Golden Eagles Tabbed To Win 11th Straight Mid-Con Title

After winning its record 10th straight league championship a year ago, the Golden Eagles was selected to claim its 11th consecutive Summit League title in 2008 as voted on by the league's eight head coaches. ORU (49 points) were a unanimous selection after garnering seven first-place votes (coaches are not allowed to vote for their own teams).

Western Illinois (40 points) finished second in the voting, while Centenary (35 points) came in third with the final first-place vote. League newcomer South Dakota State (31 points) was close behind in fourth, while Southern Utah (25 points) was selected in the fifth slot. Oakland (21 points), North Dakota State (15 points) and IPFW (8 points) rounded out the voting.

ORU Earns Preseason No. 40 National Ranking

The Golden Eagles received a No. 40 ranking in the Collegiate Baseball newspapers Fabulous 40 pre-

HEAD COACH ROB WALTON

Rob Walton is in his fifth season as head coach at ORU and is the winningest coach in school history with a 173-64 (.730) record.

Walton, who is regarded as one of the brightest minds in college baseball, was named the headcoach of Team USA Baseball for the summer of '08.

Under Walton's tutelage in 2007, the Golden Eagles reeled off their 10th straight 40-win season en route to becoming just the fourth team in NCAA history to claim 10 consecutive conference championships. Despite playing one of their toughest schedules to date, the Golden Eagles finished their season as one of the hottest teams in baseball winning 25 of 28 games.

In 2006, Walton led the Golden Eagles to their first NCAA Super Regional berth after sweeping through the Fayetteville Regional. Although the Golden Eagles suffered a pair of heart-breaking losses at Clemson, ORU enjoyed arguably its best season since the 1978 squad advanced to the College World Series.

Under Walton's guidance, ORU finished the 2006 season ranked in the top 25 of all three major polls. The Golden Eagles posted a 41-16 record and were ranked 14th (Collegiate Baseball), 17th (Baseball America), and 19th (USA Today/ABCA) at the end of the year.

Though the 2005 club was long on pitching and short on offense, the Golden Eagles still managed to impress the college baseball world. ORU split a four-game series at No. 8 Miami, enjoyed wins at No. 8 Baylor and versus No. 22 Wichita State. ORU's prowess against the nation's elite helped earn the Golden Eagles a No. 3 seed at the Clemson Regional.

At Clemson, the Golden Eagles advanced to the finals for the second straight season, only to fall to the host-Tigers. ORU was 2-2 at Clemson.

While he's beginning to earn marks as a head coach, Walton has long been considered one of college baseball's top pitching instructors. He was rewarded for his expertise when he served as Team USA's pitching coach during their 2005 summer tour.

When ORU found itself looking for a head coach soon after the conclusion of the 2003 season, the athletic administration didn't have to look far or for too long. Walton was not only the number one choice to replace the departed Sunny Golloway, he was the *only* choice.

Widely credited with building ORU teams which were a combined 232-82 (.739) over the previous five seasons, Walton was named ORU's eighth head coach at a press conference on June 11th, 2003

The former Oklahoma State pitching star joined ORU prior to the 1999 season and was instrumental in building a program which won the Mid-Continent Conference championship and advanced to NCAA Regional play each year.

Under Walton's guidance, the ORU pitching staff has become one of the nation's finest, ranking among the NCAA top 25 in team earned run average in each of the last five seasons. From 2000 through 2002, the Golden Eagles set a new team season strikeout record each year. As recruiting coordinator, Walton has seen several of his classes receive national recognition, including the 2003 class which ranked 25th nationally by Collegiate Baseball.

In Walton's tenure at ORU, 14 pitchers have either been drafted or have signed professional contracts, including Jackson Markert, an 11th-round pick of the San Francisco Giants. Markert won the 2001 Rolands Minor League Relief Award, given to the top relief pitcher in the minors.

Walton has also coached seven All-Americans, six Mid-Continent Conference Pitchers of the Year, and had 16 first-team all-conference pitching selections.

Walton had an extensive and illustrious career in collegiate baseball, competing for Oklahoma State from 1983-86. At OSU he compiled an overall record of 20-6 and helped lead the Cowboys to four straight College World Series.

A native of Rutherford, N.J., Walton and his wife Michelle have been married 17 years. They have three children: sons Davis (16) and Donovan (13), and daughter Cassie (9).

Walton Selected to Lead Team USA National Team in Summer of '08

Oral Roberts University baseball head coach Rob Walton has been named USA Baseball National Team head coach for 2008, USA Baseball announced on Friday. Walton previously helped lead the 2005 USA Baseball National Team as an assistant coach.

"With Coach Walton's experience in professional baseball and his elevation of the Oral Roberts baseball program into a national power, we are very excited to have him manage the National Team program in 2008," said Eric Campbell, USA Baseball General Manager of National Teams.

"It's quite an honor. I'm really humbled and feel very privileged to be chosen as head coach. This is an opportunity to represent our country and to coach some of the best players in college baseball," said Walton. "I enjoyed my first tour with Team USA (as an assistant in 2005). If I had a choice, I'd do this every summer.

"I want to thank (USA Baseball General Manager of National Teams) Eric Campbell and everyone else at USA Baseball for having the faith and confidence to select me as National Team head coach."

The 2008 USA Baseball National Team will begin a pre-trials training camp in conjunction with the New England Collegiate Baseball League beginning June 10, 2008. Starting June 20, USA Baseball will partner with Coastal Plain League franchises to present the National Team Trials.

The 2008 National Team will be named on June 24 and will begin a seven-game series vs. the Chinese Taipei National Team from June 25-July 1 including stops in Durham, NC and Cary, NC. This will be the fifth installment of the international friendship series between the U.S. and Chinese Taipei.

The National Team will then head to Europe on July 2 and compete in the 2008 Dutch Honkbal Tournament and a two-game series versus the Czech Republic National Team. On July 18, the U.S. squad will begin the IV FISU World Collegiate Championship in Brno, Czech Republic. The USA is the defending gold medalists in the last two FISU championships.

Duffy Named to Golden Spikes Watch List

Brendan Duffy was one of the 75 players named to the 2008 Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List by USA Baseball on Feb. 15.

The Glendale, Ariz. native earned 2007 Mid-Continent Conference (now The Summit League) co-Player of the Year honors after leading the Golden Eagles to a 40-17 record and their 10th straight conference title. Duffy hit a team-leading .356 with 10 doubles, 29 RBI and 21 stolen bases. The two-time all-conference performer hit an impressive .507 with 35 hits and 17 RBI in conference play last season.

Sullivan Earns Preseason All-American Honors

Sophomore hurler **Jerry Sullivan** was named Preseason Third-Team All-American by Ping!Baseball. Sullivan earns the first preseason honor for the Golden Eagles after establishing himself as a freshman last season. The Budd Lake, N.J. native went 5-0 and ranked second on the team with a 2.04 ERA. Sullivan fanned 45 batters in 53.0 innings of work including a complete-game shutout at then-No. 10 Wichita State.

The right-handed hurler was named College Baseball's Freshman of the Week by rivals.com after the gem against Wichita State on April 17. He also earned All-America honors by Collegiate Baseball and Ping!Baseball.

Golden Eagles in Elite Company

With their 10th consecutive conference championship in 2007, ORU tied Texas for the third-longest streak in NCAA Division I history. Oklahoma State won 16 consecutive Big Eight crowns from 1981-96, and Wichita State won 14 Missouri Valley titles in a row from 1987-2000. Texas won 10 straight Southwest Conference Championships on two different occasions.

ORU Tabs 11 Athletes in Fall Signing Period

Rob Walton announced the signing of 11 student-athletes to National Letters-of-Intent on Dec. 17. Nine of the players come from the junior college ranks, while two of the prep athletes are still in high school. The Golden Eagles

signed three outfielders, one infielder, one catcher, four pitchers, and two multi-positional athletes.

The incoming class of 2008 includes; RHP **Drew Bowen** (Tulsa Memorial H.S.), RHP/INF **Jeff Burleson** (Bakersfield College), RHP/OF **Andrew Dilling** (Rocklin High School), OF **Chris Elder** (Sacramento City College), C **Seth Furmanek** (Chandler-Gilbert C.C.), OF **Tyler Garewal** (Bakersfield College), RHP **Brent Klinger** (Glendale C.C.), RHP **Spencer Roberts** (Chandler-Gilbert C.C.), RHP **Taylor Stanton** (Diablo Valley J.C.), INF **Louie Templeton** (Yavapai College), and OF **Ronnie Welty** (Chandler-Gilbert C.C.).

ORU Baseball History

The Golden Eagles have appeared in 19 NCAA Regionals since the baseball program began in 1966. The Golden Eagles earned their first-ever birth in 2006 into the NCAA Super Regional since the NCAA expanded to a 64 team field in 1997. ORU made an appearance in the 1978 College World Series, defeating North Carolina in the opener and losing a pair of one-run games to Arizona State and Miami. ORU has 13 major leaguers to its credit, including former Atlanta Braves infielder **Keith Lockhart**. Other notable Major Leaguers include former Minnesota Twins catcher **Tom Nieto**; ex-Boston Red Sox outfielder **Bob Zupcic**, and former Oakland A's reliever **Todd Burns**.

In 1981, RHP **Mike Moore** was the No. 1 overall draft pick by Seattle and went on to a 14-year career, winning a World Series title and appearing in the All-Star game with Oakland in 1989.

Up Next

ORU will host LeMoyne in their opening homestand this next weekend at J.L. Johnson Stadium. The Golden Eagles and the Dolphins will play Friday at 3 p.m., Saturday at 2 p.m., and conclude the three-game series on Sunday at 1 p.m. ORU has not lost a home opener to start the season since 1990 when they fell to Oklahoma Christian, 13-9.
